## WALKS AND DISCOVERIES

*Murray Darling Junction Island Reserve*

*New modern landscaping, toilet facilities, fire pit and interpretive information.*

Take a leisurely stroll along the island dividing the two greatest rivers in Australia, the Murray and Darling. The 1km cleared bush walking track is an escape into nature, filled with native shrubbery and birdlife, to the meeting point of the Murray Darling Junction.

*Australian Inland Botanic Gardens*

*Set on 50 hectares displaying arid and exotic flora, historic buildings, Rose Garden and Children's Garden. As the first semi-arid botanical gardens in the southern hemisphere, this is where the desert really comes into bloom. The plantings showcase a wide variety of Australian and exotic species, the centrepiece of which may be the rose garden featuring over 1600 colour co-ordinated bushes.*

*Weir & Lock 10 Lawns*

*Lock 10 is one of 13 locks and 15 weirs situated along the Murray River.*

Construction was completed in 1929 and is 830kms from the Murray Mouth. The Locks & Weirs maintain a high-water level for navigation and pumping and is intrinsic today as an irrigation source. Lush lawns surround the area ideal for a picnic with splendid views of the rivers.

## *Theopa Lagoon Reserve*

*Is a non-permanent freshwater wetland that supports a healthy and diverse array of native flora and fauna.*

Wetlands have significant recreational and scenic values, providing a setting for bird watching, bush walking, horse riding, fishing and picnicking. A detailed map is available at the Wentworth Visitor Information Centre.

## *Perry Sandhills*

*Over the first sand dune, stand in the canopy of a 500 year old Murray River Red Gum tree, known as the "God Tree".*

According to geologists, the Perry Sandhills originated after an Ice Age, 40,000 years ago; formed by wind erosion over thousands of years. Skeletal remains of giant mega-fauna have been found here. Replicas of these animals are now on show at the Wentworth Pioneer Museum.
